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# **BEGOÑA ZUBER**(



#### Begoña Zubero (Bilbao, 1962)

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Studied Audiovisual Communication at the Complutense University of Madrid (1980-1985). She trained as a photographer at Isabel Matoses' studio and at the School of Visual Arts in New York (1987-1990).

From the very first projects she has developed a photographic thesis of impeccable, formal and aesthetic technical invoice, in which documentation and research have allowed her to produce images of great intellectual depth.

Throughout her career she has traveled different genres, from realistic photography of urban spaces and still lifes to her experimentation with the abstraction of subjective photography. Attracted by the architecture of power of the European totalitarian regimes of the 20th century, she arrived in Rome in 2002, starting her project Existez (2002-2013). This project has also taken place in Berlin, Warsaw, in the concentration camps of Auschwitz, Birkenau and Majdanek, as well as in Moscow and Yerevan.

In 2012 she moved to Rome as a resident artist at the Royal Academy of Spain, from where she continued her exploration of the importance of

the idea of memory, participating in the ideological use of architectural and urban spaces.

As a consequence of his Italian time, Begoña projects in recent years have returned to issues related to the culture and recent history of this country. Together with the architect Ignacio González Galán, she participated in the XIV Venice Architecture Biennale, curated by Rem Koolhas, with the Cinecittà Occupata project (2014), within the Monditalia section in the Arsenale space, providing photographs focused on the importance of architectural space and sociological of Cinecittà.

It has been part of the Extraordinary Visions exhibition, Italy looks at us (2016) at the MAXXI Museum in Rome, celebrated on the occasion of the 70th anniversary of the Italian Republic. The photographic selections on this occasion are part of the Gente del Po project, part of the interest in the complete relations between culture and ideology during the fascist period and specifically in the figure of Michelangelo Antonioni. This work was a tour in her career, presenting the landscape as an object of study as a repository of identity, memory and imagination. This project was presented in its entirety at the Sala Artegunea de Tabakalera in San Sebastián (2017) and later at the Niemeyer Center in Avilés (2018).

In 2019 she participated in Matera in the events of the European Capital of Culture with the exhibition La cultura è capitale.

Begoña has carried out artistic residencies in Cosenza and in the Dolomites, developing in the latter the Villagio Eni project, exhibited at the Altxerri Gallery during the First San Sebastián Architecture Biennial and at the Luis Burgos Gallery in Madrid in the context of the PHotoESPAÑA 2018 festival.

Her last residence to date has been in Iraq at the end of 2018 with the sponsorship of the Moving Artist Foundation, an organization that aims to connect visual artists from conflict zones with those of the Basque Country. Among the projects carried out there we find M/D (Mosul Demolition),

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which has given rise to the NEEEV exhibition, Non è esotico è vitale (2020) presented at the Fondazione Sant'Elia in Palermo.

It includes photographs of the moment when the ruined city returns to everyday life thanks to the surprising strength of the human condition after the terrible battle carried out against the Islamic

Begoña currently lives and works between Italy and Bilbao.
